#### B. TRUSTEE REPORT - M. PASCUCCI

- Provincial elections to be held shortly. Trustee Pascucci stresses the importance of safety within schools during polling will be reviewed between the board and election officials.
- The board voted regarding the display of the Pride flag within DPCDSB schools. They passed a ruling to allow only the Canadian flag where one flagpole is present. Where there is more than one flagpole, schools would display the Canadian flag, provincial flag, and sacred heart flag.
- Trustee Pascucci put forth a motion regarding the uniform policy with new guidelines that allow schools to discuss the option of having a uniform. Starting Sept 1st, schools may state whether they want to implement a uniform policy, by Feb 1st schools may ask parents if they wish to implement a uniform policy, and by March 1st the decision must be reviewed by school administrators. By April 1st a standardized questionnaire will go out to the community and requires 60% of the population to be in favour to proceed.
- The board is \$68M in deficit, but with the upcoming budget presentation Trustee Pascucci suggests that we, the St. Alfred community, submit a motion to the Ministry to appeal for funds to improve the school and bring it up to the standard of other schools within our board.

#### C. TREASURER REPORT – M. MANUEL

- Current balance \$4,527.56 as at November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024 (payment for spirit wear to be deducted)
- Grant for Parent engagement received \$500
- Spirit Wear made approximately \$550.31 in profit (\$1,636.60 was the total amount before invoice paid)
- Projected for Dec, \$1,132 profit for Terracotta cookies
- Projected for Dec, \$735.65 profit for Subway lunch \$3212.90 deposit (each week \$275.25 gets deducted for 9 weeks)
- Balance end \$8870.51 as at December 31st

  of activities within the classroom
- Welcoming new staff member Nicola Hughes, as a literacy facilitator to support the grade 1 and 2 students on the Empower Learning program.
- Grade 8 students have signed up for their first secondary classes and transition plans will continue into the spring
- Feb 14 PA day and Feb 17 is family day, long weekend for the students
- All schools will get a refresh of tech inventory. Old devices will be decommissioned by the end of this school year. Goal is that every school will have a 1:4 ratio for K-2, 1:2 grade 3-6, 1:1 for grade 7-8
